

OVERVIEW & PURPOSE

- The purpose of this guide is to provide answers and expectations during our time of virtual learning.
- Our hope is to maintain academic rigor while providing a sense of stability to our students and their families.

EXPECTATIONS

- Students will be asked to complete a daily activity and read for 30 minutes each day. A list of activities will be provided to your student.
- In order to receive credit, parents will send a picture of the completed activity *for at least two* of the weeks' activities from their classes. You can send this via email, text, Remind, etc. Your child's teacher will let you know what means of delivery they prefer.
- Students should be able to complete daily assignments in approximately 3 hours. Some students may need additional time, others may require less.
- Parents and students may receive additional suggestions for extended learning from their teacher.
 - Please use the teacher webpages from the school website to receive class assignments for each grade 6-12.

HOW TO PICK UP WORK AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS (Following CDC Guidelines)

• Students will be able to pick up their materials needed for distance learning on Tuesday, April 7th, from 8:00 am to 1:00 pm. Students/parents will be able to pick up any belongings at this time as well. Your child's personal belongings will be ready to be taken home. Any school property, such as library books or laptops, will also need to be returned at this time as well.

VIRTUAL - PARENT/STUDENT GUIDE HOW TO COMMUNICATE WITH MY CHILD'S TEACHER(S)

- •Teachers will have daily office hours to assist your child and help students with any problems that might arise. Office hours will be held in a virtual platform that will be selected by your child's teacher. This may include but is not limited to: Facebook, text message, Google Meet, Google Classroom, email or phone calls.

A weekly activities list will be provided online (and through teacher contact if you have no online access) beginning on April 6, 2020. There will be a weekly checklist that is to be returned electronically to your child's teacher. Returning this signed checklist will ensure your child receives credit for their completed activities/reading log.
